# Two promotions and more acceptances

## Various ways of looking at leaves

The highlight of the Society monthly meeting in June was an open discussion of members' interpretation of the subject "Leaves".

Members could enter a maximum of three images on the subject, which they could interpret as they wished.

These images were discussed, not evaluated.

The idea was to improve our skills of observation, to develop an "eye for seeing" and to inspire one another.
